It is the pleasure of the Research, Studies and Planning Department to present to the followers of the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters activities with the first comprehensive integrated statistical work that reflects the most important statistical variables of the Council during the fiscal year 2014/2015. This work has been released after a real effort by which the management has laid the traditions of statistical work. This humbly makes this product the first step in building a scientific-based numerical documentation of activities and festivities of the Council.

The following steps in our statistical journey will pour into one direction, which is founding the scientific statistical bases to develop the various statistical analyses methods to assist decision makers in the field of cultural and artistry activities presented by the Council of the scientific development of various statistical analysis methods, to serve the decision-makers at the level of artistic and cultural services provided by the Council, with the intention to deploy the most advanced analysis models for the decision maker.

This ambition is justified by the Department's success in transforming narrative language into numerical format. Today, we can say that in the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters, we have the statistical foundation that we can rely on.

At the current stage of the development process in Kuwait, the Department presents this effort as a token to all people of the country and to His Highness the Amir, may Allah protect him, the patron of the renaissance of Kuwait, as he, His Highness, places culture in the forefront of his interest with the belief of its importance to the overall comprehensive development in all areas.



Definitions Used

- Activities: The main components of the cultural or artistic event, such as opening and closing ceremonies, lectures, seminars, theater performances and poetry readings, art exhibitions, book fairs and concerts.
- Events: Creative performances provided throughout the activities such as solo or group singing in the lyrical (songful) evening and the number of music pieces played in the musical evening.
- Participants: Everyone involved in the activity, whether in a major or a minor role, as well as
 participants in artistical or technical workshops and training sessions and competitions.
- Opening Ceremony or Closing Ceremony: The festive activity that takes place at the
 beginning and the end of a cultural or an artistic event (such as festivals, book fairs, or
 seminars), and is recorded as one activity regardless of cultural and artistic diversity included
 in the even as to avoid duplication in counting for the activity. However, events are considered
 as any other activities.
- Celebration: An overall activity dedicated to commemorate the historic, scientific, cultural or artistic event and it includes several activities on the occasion of this event.
- Symposium: It is considered as one activity whether carried on in a single day or more.
 It is distinct from the lecture or seminar or workshop in that a symposium includes the provision of working papers and the records of the discussions which cover different aspects for clarifications.
- Applied Seminar: A seminar dedicated to the discussion of a specific work of art with its providers. This is mostly held within theater festivals' activities.
- Lecture: A meeting with a specified title between one lecturer (or more) and a receiving audience with attention paid to the audience discussions.
- Open Meeting: A meeting with an open dialogue between a writer or an intellectual person, or an artist or any creative person (one or more) and the public. It does not have a specific title or subject and is subject to the initiative of the moment.
- Seminar: It may take a day or more and is dedicated to discuss a specific topic among a number of specialists.
- Art workshop: A meeting between specialists and non-specialists if the purpose of it is training (in this situation would be called a training workshop). In this case, the workshop would be characterized by following a process or experimental methods. A workshop could also contain only experts to as to share experiences among each other. Non experts could attend for the benefit of the knowledge.
- Workshop: A meeting among experts to discuss specific issues and in which brief working papers could be provided.
- Training Course: A training program with a specific topic and a specific time line presented by a specialist to enhance and develop the skill or scientific knowledge of trainees.

- General Conference: A meet among professional experts (either from within the country or from abroad) and an audience of participants. The conference would have specified sessions and themes that are organized under one title. It is characterized by having a sizeable number of participants of specialists and the public and by arriving at final recommendations and closing declaration at the end of the conference.
- Forum: A meeting between an expert (or experts) with the audience of participants in an open discussion of a subject (or subjects) without working papers. Sometimes the forum takes the same name of the activity itself.
- Literary Evening: An activity to review novels or short stories or it could combine both storytelling and poetry arts activities.
- Poetry Evening: An activity that is merely dedicated to poetry regardless of its type.
- Lyrical Concerts "Lyrical Evening": An activity that could be limited to a solo singing or the singing or group singing. It would be identified by the nationality of the singers and when it includes singers from different nationality it is then called "Lyrical Evenings".
- Folkloric Lyrical Art: A folkloric singing that describes a specific area or country. It is differentiated by the nationality if the performer or group of performers.
- Choir Evening: An evening that is merely limited to group singing. It is represented in the statistical tables based on the nationality of the performers or the type of the performance as sometimes such activities is dedicated only to folkloric Choir.
- Musical Concert: An evening that is merely limited to instrumentals performances. It is
 presented in the statistical tables by the type of music played such as Kuwaiti, Arabic,
 Asian, Foreign (which includes European, American, and Latin American music) or
 classical.
- Folkloric Arts: These include folk dances and may include solo folkloric singing or folkloric choir. Such arts could also be limited to the folkloric dances only. They are identified by the nationality of the performing team.
- Book Fair: The display of books whether for the purpose of exhibiting books only or for both exhibiting and selling.
- Puppet Show: Includes all puppet shows, whether hand manipulated glove-type, marionettes on strings or wires type puppets or shadow plays.
- Visual Arts Exhibition: An exhibition that includes all types of arts from paintings, sculpturing and crafting.
- Photography Exhibition: Photography is considered by some people as part of the visual arts. However, in this book we classified it as a separate art with its own dedicated statistics for better clarifications.
- Art Exhibitions: Are the exhibitions that include mixed types of art such as individuals' belongings, paintings, sculptures, photographs, and collectables of antiques or personal items.
- Scientific Exhibitions: Exhibitions that only display models of scientific illustrations and inventions, maps, tools and labs' equipment used in scientific research.

- Cultural Minaret: An activity that is dedicated to commemorate or honor an individual of the Kuwaiti characters that has an influential footprint in his/her field, whether alive or in perpetuation of his/her memory. This activity would include a printed brochure to acquaint audience with that character, also a lectures to identify the character in an open discussion about his/her role and contributions.
- Theatrical Scenes: These could be scenes extracted out of a theatrical performance or short tailored scenes created specifically for a particular purpose.
- Theatrical/Musical Performances/ Shows: Dancing performances that include acting or lyrical scenes or both.
- Family Day: A day dedicated for the family and it includes art workshops for children and museum tours and music.
- Kuwaiti Delegation: This includes a Kuwaiti team specialized in surveying, excavating and protection and maintenance of monuments. This is in addition to the team's bilateral cooperation with other foreign delegations in the field of archaeological exploration.
- Foreign Delegation: The foreign team specialized in surveying, exploring, or restoring at the archaeological sites in cooperation with its counterpart Kuwaiti team.
- Archaeological Discoveries: Any archaeological discovery that is recorded in particular
 year does not necessarily mean that all the work done for such discovery has actually taken
 place in that same year as some of these archaeological discoveries require many excavating
 seasons to finally achieve the final discovery.
- Collectibles Books: A collection of Arabic and foreign books that the library acquired via the known common ways of acquisition which includes buying, receiving as gifts from publishing houses or placements by authors and publishers.
- Private Libraries: Libraries that individuals had donated to the National Library of Kuwait.
- Arab Heritage Library: A specialized library of books of ancient and modern Arab heritage.
- Rare Books: Books that are not necessarily limited to heritage and do not also include manuscripts. Instead they include rare publications, whether in Arabic or other foreign languages.
- Collection of Books and Tomes: Includes the above four categories












The Geographical Distribution of Al-Qurain's 21st Cultural Festival Guests

The 17th International Music Festival, June 2014





The 16th Children and Youth Festival




Summer Cultural Festival- Auguest 20th- Septemper 4th, 2014







Documentation of Saad and Saed Hills' Moneouments is the prelimiery lists for the World Culture

The file of Saad and Saed Hills' moneouments in the archiological area in Failaka Island was recorded in the prelimiery list for the World Culture locations in Februery 27, 2015 under the number WHC/74/310/12/15. The significance of tehse locations are as follow:

First: Saad Hill

This location is known as the Delmon City which included the settelment stages of the Delmon civilization(1) through which several houses, wells and some of the furnaces. Moreover, a temple was built for worshipping the god "Anzac".

Second: Saed Hill

At this location, a castle was built at the beginning of the third century B.C after the control of Seleucid Empire over most of the world regions. The castle is squere shaped with towers and squred corners, some towers at the main entrance gatesin addition to two templs for Greek god. At a later stage, the castle was surrounded with a ditch to protect the catle from the attacks of the people of Failaka Island.

⁽¹⁾ The Dilmun civilization center, five thousand years ago, was mainly in Bahrain Islands and the Isle of Tarot in Qatif. It and extended along the east coast of the Arabian Peninsula from Kuwait at Failaka Island to the borders of "Majan" civilization in the Sultanate of Oman and "Umm Al Nar" civilization in the Emirate of Abu Dhubi. "Delmon" was known by its name throughout history because it was surrounded by sea water at everyside. It represented a strategic center of the ancient world being the link between the Middle East and the Near East countries, connecting at the the north, the civilization of "Mesopotamia" -now Iraq- and in the east the civilization of «Milokha» in the Indus Valley (India) and in Egypt, the civilization of the Pharaoh


